Reception: Mary Anning Class



Last week we had great fun learning about churches and what happens in them. We looked around a church online and noticed features such as the font, stained glass windows, the pews, the cross and the altar. As part of our learning we focused on weddings, talking about why people get married and what happens in a wedding ceremony.

The children had great fun designing and making hats, outfits and buttonholes that they wore when we acted out a wedding service and everyone took it in turns pretending to get married!

This week we have begun learning about airports and the jobs people do in them. We will continue to learn about airports next week and will celebrate the end of our year in Reception by getting on a plane and going to Hawaii!



Year 1: Garrett Morgan Class



This week in Year 1, the children have been counting to 100 and partitioning numbers in Maths and in English, they have been writing their fact files on The Titanic and creating a ship's log. In Clarborough Curriculum, the children have been completing their 'Show me what you know' on The Titanic and in Computing, they have been adding narration using text and direct speech using speech bubbles. In PE, the children enjoyed a good game of rounders! Next week, lots of fun activities have been planned for the final week of term!

Year 2: Professor Brian Cox Class



This week, in Maths, Year 2 have been solving problems involving capacity. In English, the children wrote a recount about their visit to The Butterfly House and in Clarborough Curriculum, the children learnt about who created the World Wide Web (www). In Computing, Year 2 learnt how to put a hyperlink into their eBooks to embed a video and in French, they revisited their learning on numbers and conversation.

Year 3: Mary Jackson Class



This week, in Maths, Year 3 have been focusing on the times tables x3, x4 and x8 together with interpreting and reading pictograms. In English, they read 'Hortense and the Shadow' which is a book about a little girl who is afraid of her shadow. The children answered a range of questions about the story and also wrote a poem using prepositions to show time and place. In Clarborough Curriculum, Year 3 had to describe and understand how the UK has changed over time through their topic of 'Our Changing Nation'. In Art/DT, the children added buttons to their final designs and completed their pencil cases! In French, they learnt 'Incy Wincy Spider'.

Next week, Year 3 will be completing their 'Show me what you know' based on their learning this term and will enjoy some transitional activities in preparation for Year 4!

Year 4: Richard Leakey Class



In Maths this week, Year 4 have been demonstrating their understanding of various topics through Maths stories. Each day, the children have had a different 'story adventure' that only progresses when they solve the calculations, codes or puzzles. This week, they have completed place value, addition, subtraction, length and multiplication problems. In English, the children have finished their persuasive speeches on why children are so important. The children have also begun to look at and read the book, 'Shackleton's Journey' and preparing to write a persuasive letter asking people to join him on his expedition. In Clarborough

Curriculum, Year 4 have been identifying modern wonders in The Americas and had to pick one to create a detailed presentation about to persuade the audience to visit it. In Computing, they were given the option of different activities. Some children chose to create a new E-book, others created a new Scratch game and others chose to create new 3D animations.

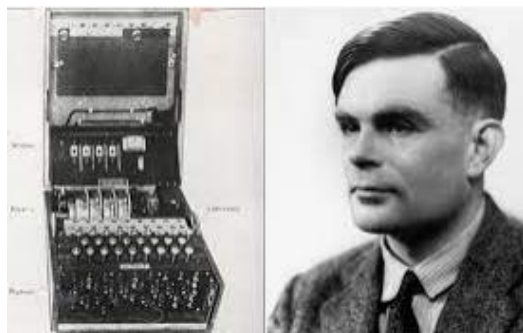
Next week, Year 4 will be taking part in more mathematical adventures and in English, they will be writing letters to Shackleton and stories. In Clarborough Curriculum, the children will be taking part in an Arctic adventure and looking at modern kit versus old kit equipment. In Science, they will be continuing to look at the light spectrum and in RE they will be looking at Christian holy places.

Year 5: Hedy Lamarr Class



This week, Year 5 have been looking at translation, symmetry and reflection of shapes. They have enjoyed writing an explanation text in English and in Clarborough Curriculum, they have been understanding how rivers are used, who uses them and the impact of waste on our rivers. In Science, the children have been investigating irreversible changes and in Art, they have been sewing decorations onto their phone cases and selecting decorative qualities.

Year 6: Alan Turing Class



This week, the Year 6 children have been busy practising for their End of Year Assembly next week! They enjoyed dancing at C-Fest on Wednesday and are looking forward to their fun-filled activity week next week!

Nottinghamshire County Council use CCTV cars to enforce parking outside of schools. They visit schools in Nottinghamshire and will record whilst passing, the details of any cars parked illegally.

If vehicles are in parked in contravention the registered keepers will receive a Penalty Charge Notice.

These restrictions are in place to provide a safe area outside of the school where the children will gather or cross the road therefore, we ask for your help in keeping this area free of parked vehicles. The school can request enforcement from the car if there any concerns regarding parking.

Our CCTV car is now out patrolling Nottinghamshire schools to help discourage dangerous and inconsiderate parking.

Motorists caught parking on restricted areas near schools or in bus stops will be issued with a Penalty Charge Notice (PCN) of £70.



Parking on school keep clear markings can seriously endanger road safety for children. Please only park in marked areas and help us keep our school children safe.
